Year 9 news:

As mentioned, Year 9 2017 students are the first cohort to be affected by the NESA's (formerly BOSTES) 'Stronger HSC' initiative which impacts the 2020 HSC.

NESA has published 36 sample questions for the online literacy and numeracy tests for students to demonstrate they meet the new minimum standard for the award of the HSC from 2020 onwards. The sample questions, while ranging in difficulty, give an indication of the level of functional literacy and numeracy required. We encourage you to have a look and gain an understanding of the content. You and your child may like to try the demonstration tests. Mr Maybury's Report

ACE Science

A week in Canberra with Science Teachers from all over Australia provided a glimpse into how other schools teach Science. One strategy is to have interested Year 7-10 students extend their knowledge with independent work in Science that is supported by their teacher or a community mentor that specialises in Science. Several students have expressed interest in this concept. Please contact Mr. Maybury if your Year 7-10 student would invite an opportunity to extend their science knowledge or you would like to become a Science mentor.

Physics

The Year 12 Physics students have been studying motors and generators this term. Their recent assessment activity required them to build Direct Current (DC) electric motors from a magnet, wire, a battery, a wooden dowel and some small metal pieces. The students found the task challenging and were concerned that it was nearly impossible given the time allowed. Extra time, effort and a better understanding of the science involved resulted in success with their motors racing along to the delight of their peers and teachers. Congratulations!

National Science Youth Forum

Applications are now open for Year 11 students to apply to attend the National Youth Science Forum in Canberra in January 2018. Rotary supports the Forum as a method to develop our future science leaders in Australia. Successful applicants are given a grant from Rotary to attend the Forum in Canberra for 10 days with other Year 12 students where they are exposed to world leaders in a variety of science disciplines. Year 10 Mathematics

The Year 10 mathematics class started the year working on probability and statistics with all students doing well on their unit topic test. More recently the students are gaining a new appreciation for the power of trigonometry in solving all kinds of real world problems.

Year 8 Science

The year 8 science class started the year examining different solutions and mixtures of materials. This led them into exploration of chemical reactions. The students have been delighted to witness the result of mixing certain chemicals. Parents are encouraged to google videos on Elephant's Toothpaste to view one of the more dramatic reactions done in class.
